

## Homework Timetable

### Half term 4

“The evidence shows that the impact of homework, on average, is five months additional progress.” (The Education Endowment Foundation)

Homework is defined as work that is set to be done outside of the timetabled curriculum

Not all homework is done at home; in fact, for some students who find it hard to work at home, or for some tasks which may require resources (books, software, equipment) more readily available at school, it is necessary or desirable to carry out the task at school.

Homework enhances student learning, improves achievement and develops students’ study skills and as such is an integral part of the curriculum. It requires careful planning and integration into the scheme of work of each curriculum area.

Homework is set in order to:

- Encourage pupils to develop effective study skills and time management techniques and the self-discipline needed to be lifelong learners.
- Consolidate, reinforce and extend the material covered in lessons.
- Prepare students for new learning activities.
- Enhance opportunities for independent learning
- Involve parents and carers in pupil learning.
- Create channels for home-school dialogue

Homework will be set across all the different subjects according to the timetable outlined below; most homework will be set on Microsoft Teams and we are working towards a system where parents will be notified of the homework that is set during the week.
