
















A Message from the Associate Head

Dear All,




You've got to be in school to win school
















Anti-Bullying Ambassadors

At Beckfoot Oakbank we work extremely hard to ensure every student in our school feels safe, whether that be in 'normal' or Covid times. We are a big school of nearly 1600 children and from time to time bullying between students does occur. As staff, we deal with it as soon as we are aware.

However, we know that some students would prefer to talk to their peers about how they are feeling. Therefore, we have created a group of student volunteers from each year group to be Anti Bullying Ambassadors for our school. They will be given training from Miss Berry on how to respond to students who would like to discuss their concerns.

We will be working closely with a charity that is supported by HRH The Duke of Cambridge: The Diana Award Anti-Bullying Campaign. It engages young people, parents and teachers to change the attitudes, behaviour and culture around bullying, building young people's skills and confidence to address different situations, online and offline.





Students Take A Scientific Approach

As everyone across the world gains a new appreciation of the importance of science and scientific endeavor, some of Beckfoot Oakbank's Year 7 students have been assessing the latest science books for young people by becoming judges for the Royal Society's annual book award.

The Royal Society Young People's Book Prize aims to promote literacy in young people and to inspire them to read about science. It also supports the writing of excellent, accessible STEM books for under-14s. The Prize is unique in that the winner is selected by judging panels made up of young people at schools across the country from a shortlist curated by

an adult judging panel, chaired by Professor Mike Kendall FRS. The panel included Cressida Cowell, the Waterstones Children's Laureate and author-illustrator of the How to Train Your Dragon books, and former Blue Peter presenter and author Konnie Huq. It was then over to the scrutinising eyes of more than 13,000 young judges, drawn from over 500 schools, science centres and community groups from across the UK, to read and declare their champion.

The winning title, announced at a virtual award ceremony in March 2021, was "Cats react to Science Facts"

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Meet the Teacher!



Who are you and what is your role in school?

I am Mr Hardicre and my role at Beckfoot Oakbank is as Deputy Headteacher (Teaching & Learning). This means I am responsible for supporting your teachers to deliver the best lessons they can. We do this together as a team by continually learning from each other and researching what works best to help you learn. But I do a lot more than that as I also teach geography to students in years 7 and 9, and you'll see me about on duty a lot. I also support Miss Rhodes and Mr Gill as a link for Year 8 and through this take a particular interest in how Year 8 students are getting

Why did you want to be a teacher?

This comes from my time as a coach at Cheshire County FA. I took a year out before university and whilst working full time as a technician in a school I trained for my FA coaching badges and enjoyed working with children in my coaching role. Through the success I had I was keen to work with children, whilst also retaining an interest in geography, which I studied at university. Teaching, therefore, was the ideal vocation for me.

What did you do before you worked at Beckfoot Oakbank?

I've done a few jobs before arriving at Beckfoot Oakbank. I worked as a football coach at Cheshire FA before training to teach. I got my first job teaching geography in Altrincham before moving north to be Head of Geography at St. Cuthbert's High School in Rochdale. Having enjoyed some success there I moved across to be Head of Humanities at Siddal Moor (now called Newhouse Academy) in Heywood, where I worked for 8 years. My final role there was as Assistant Head with responsibility for Assessment and Progress.

What made you want to work here?

The area of Keighley holds a special place in my heart as I have family ties in the area and I spent a lot of time as a youngster in Oakworth - particularly in Holden Park. So when the opportunity arose to join the school I felt it was an opportunity to contribute something positive to an area that brought me great joy as a child. I was also keen to work in the Beckfoot Trust as our values and beliefs about education are very similar.

If you could teach any other subject what would it be and why?

This would be between PE (having been a football coach for many years) and Maths (which I love - having taught it for a short while and loving the problem solving). I think Maths would win out as it provides the basis for so much in life and can open so many doors for students.

Lastly, what is your spirit animal?


