PLANTS AND THE ENVIRONMENT

- **SOIL SCIENTIST**
Analyse characteristics of soil, the different soil types, and research the ability plants and animals have to survive in different conditions.
- **MARINE BIOLOGIST**
Study and research the ocean and aquatic life. Care for sick sea creatures and marine life.
- **ECOLOGIST**

- **NANOTECHNOLOGIST**
Use Nano-scale Biology to develop materials, equipment, and drugs.
- **MICROBIOLOGIST**
Study microbes to find out how they affect our lives and how we can use them.

SCIENCE

- **CLINICAL SCIENTIST**
Research, develop, and test methods of diagnosis. Clinical scientists interpret test results and suggest treatments to doctors.
- **MATERIALS CHEMIST**
Look at objects, focus on a certain property, and find ways to improve them.

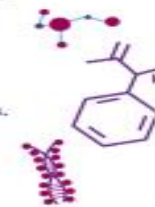

Dismantle structures and buildings, remove hazardous materials, and carry out salvage operations.

PRODUCT AND FURNITURE DESIGN

- **PRODUCT DESIGNER**
Create new products, improve existing ones, and investigate how existing products work.
- **FURNITURE DESIGNER**
Produce designs for mass-produced furniture, furniture made in small batches or unique pieces.
- **UPHOLSTERER**
Pad and cover, or re-cover, furniture with materials like leather, suede or cotton.

Design and create the setting for a television, theatre or film production.
- **EXHIBITION DESIGNER**
Work with organisations and individuals to turn their ideas into engaging displays.
- **ARCHITECT**
Design new buildings and work on the restoration and conservation of existing buildings.



GRAPHIC DESIGN AND TECHNOLOGY

- **GRAPHIC DESIGNER**
Create visual branding, adverts, brochures, magazines, website designs, product packaging, and displays.
- **WEB DESIGNER**
Use their creative and technical skills to design new websites and redesign existing ones.
- **DESIGN AND DEVELOPMENT ENGINEER**
Research and develop ideas for new products and the systems used to make them.



TEXTILE AND APPAREL DESIGN

- **FASHION DESIGNER**
Design clothing and fashion ranges, analysing or predicting trends in fabrics, colours, and shapes.
- **COSTUME DESIGNER**
Responsible for the overall look of the clothes and costumes in theatre, film, or television productions.
- **FOOTWEAR DESIGNER**
Create new designs and sample patterns for men's, women's, and children's footwear.

CIVIL ENGINEER

Design new buildings and spaces around them, and work on the restoration and conservation of existing buildings.

Responsible for the success of building projects, making sure that the work is completed safely, within budget, and on time.

FINE ARTS



DRAWING AND PAINTING

- **ILLUSTRATOR**
Produce drawings, paintings or diagrams for use in products like books and greetings cards, or on packaging.
- **FINE ARTIST**
Create original works of art using methods like painting, drawing, and sculpture.
- **TATTOOIST**
Tattooists create permanent artwork on their clients' bodies.



FASHION

- **TEXTILE DESIGNER**
Create fabric designs and patterns for woven, knitted, and printed materials for clothes or interior furnishings.
- **KNITTER**
Produce garments, soft furnishings, and accessories by hand and on knitting machines.
- **HAT DESIGNER**
Use creative skills to design and make hats.
- **JEWELLERY DESIGN**
Plan the style and pattern of jewellery, silverware, and other decorative products.



COMMUNICATIONS

- **COMMUNITY ARTS WORKER**
Help local communities plan and take part in activities like drama, dance, painting, and photography.
- **ART GALLERY CURATOR**
Manage collections of paintings and objects. Curators research, identify, and catalogue paintings.
- **ARTS VALUER**
Diagnose and solve software and hardware problems for computer users.



FILM AND MEDIA

- **VISUAL EFFECTS ARTIST**
Sometimes referred to as an FX or VFX artist, the main aim of the job is to make something computer generated look as realistic as possible in post production.
- **FILM COLOURIST**
Define a colour palette for adverts, films, and music videos to help set the tone and mood of the piece.
- **ANIMATOR**
Bring drawings and computer generated characters to life on screen.

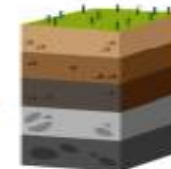

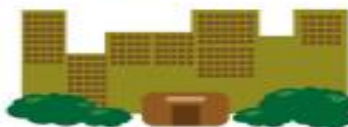
PHYSICAL ENVIRONMENT

- **GEOGRAPHER**
Study the nature of the earth's surface, relating and interpreting interactions of physical and cultural phenomena.
- **GEOSCIENTIST**
Study the Earth's structure and formation, and analyse rocks to explore its natural mineral and energy resources.
- **CONSERVATIONIST**
Manage and protect the environment, promote sustainability, and educate others about nature.



LANDSCAPE

- **LANDSCAPE ARCHITECTURE**
Plan, design, create, and manage the landscapes we live and work in.
- **LANDSCAPER**
Create and maintain gardens, parks, and other outdoor and interior areas.
- **TOWN PLANNER**
Help shape the way towns and cities develop, and balance the demands on land with the needs of the community.
- **TRANSPORT PLANNER**
Manage road, rail, and air transport networks at local, regional, and national level.



PLANTS AND AGRICULTURE

- **RURAL SURVEYOR**
Value the assets of farms and estates, advise clients on legal and tax issues, and plan and develop land use.
- **MINERAL SURVEYOR**
Look at the commercial potential of quarrying and mining sites, and restore sites once raw materials have been extracted.
- **ECOLOGIST**
Study the relationship between plants, animals, and the environment.



MAPPING AND CLIMATE

- **CARTOGRAPHER**
Collect information about the geography of an area to design and produce maps, charts, and pictures.
- **METEOROLOGIST**
Predict the weather by analysing information and using computer programmes.
- **SURVEYING AND MAPPING TECHNICIAN**
Perform surveying and mapping duties to obtain data used for construction, mapmaking, boundary location, mining, or other purposes.

SOCIAL SCIENCE

- **HISTORIAN**
Research, analyse, record, and interpret government and institutional records, newspapers, and other periodicals.
- **ARCHIVIST**
Look after and preserve collections of historical records and documents.
- **SOCIOLOGIST**
Study human society and social behaviour by examining the groups and social institutions that people form, as well as various social, religious, political, and business organisations.



ANTHROPOLOGY

- **ARCHAEOLOGIST**
Learn about the past by studying sites and excavating, classifying, recording, and preserving objects.
- **ANTHROPOLOGIST**
Research, evaluate, and establish public policy concerning the origins of humans; their physical, social, linguistic, and cultural development; and their behaviour.
- **CONSERVATOR**
Preserve and restore historical objects and buildings.
- **GEOGRAPHER**
Study the nature of the Earth's surface, relating and interpreting interactions of physical and cultural phenomena.



LEGAL PROFESSIONALS

- **BARRISTER**
Give specialist legal advice, advise solicitors, and represent people in court and at tribunals and public inquiries.
- **SOLICITOR**
Advise clients about the law and act on their behalf in legal matters.
- **CROWN PROSECUTOR**
Make sure that decisions to bring people to court are fair and likely to succeed.



PUBLIC SERVICE

- **MUSEUM CURATOR**
Manage collections of objects of artistic, scientific, historical, and general interest.
- **ANTIQUE DEALER**
Buy and sell old objects and collectors' items.
- **ART GALLERY CURATOR**
Use music and sound to help improve people's emotional well being, relieve stress, and improve confidence.

TRANSLATION

- **TRANSLATOR**
Convert the written word from the source language into the target language, making sure the intended meaning is conveyed.
- **INTERPRETER**
Convert the spoken word from one language into another, either face-to-face or remotely.
- **BILINGUAL SECRETARY**
Provide administrative services in English and one or more foreign languages.



WRITING

- **AUTHOR**
Produce creative work, including novels, children's books, poetry, travel, and technical writing.
- **PROOFREADER**
Check text before it's printed or published to make sure it's correct and complete.

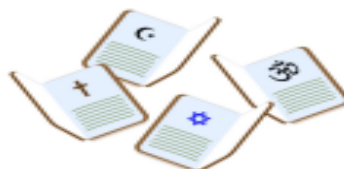
RELIGION AND GOVERNMENT

Preserve and prepare bodies from the time of death until they can be buried or cremated.

Make arrangements for burials or cremations, provide support, and advice for the bereaved.

Prepare and maintain graves and memorial sites.
