
What do we have to do to make sure everyone belongs here?

- Keep smiling. Smiling is infectious and you can spread a lot of njoyment by smiling.
- Say 'Hello!' or 'Morning' to others, and if someone speaks to you acknowledge them by replying. Walking past or ignoring them is hurtful and unkind.
- Building belonging and enjoyment makes this a nicer place for everyone to work and learn.
- Actively listening to one another showsobvious kindness, respect and genuine interest in others—this can transform someone's day. Taking an interest is powerful.
- Showing yourgratitude is good manners. Saying 'thank you' to teaching staff
 after a lesson, or to an adult or student who helps you ipolite. We all belong

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Looking more widely, older students have studied a current news article on the new Accessibility controller for the PS5 games console. The new device permits people with needs to play the console using an adapted controller. Students then debated the motivation behind such a move: profit or philanthropy? It certainly created some powerful arguments on both sides!

This week's Votes for Schools allows all our students to vote with other schools across the UK on burning topic. The live one for today is Will Science solve the World's problems? Students votes and comments will be shared with the Big Bang Festival, The Science Museum and the Royal Society amongst others — this is really powerful in showing students they have a voice that is heard and their views are considered more widely than in school.
