Subject: English
What will my assessment look like?
<p>A 45-minute assessment paper which will assess two English skills: reading and writing.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Reading: you will read a short extract from a novel you have not read before. You will then be asked to answer 9 questions asking you to explain the meaning of words, to retrieve key information from the text and explain why the writer has chosen to use particular language to describe certain things. You should use the 'what, how, why' structure to help you answer the extended answer question. • Writing: you will then be asked to write a short piece of narrative writing. You will be given a title and a prompt to use. <p>There will also be a final NGRT test to see how much your reading age has improved over the year. This will take place in lessons before the end of the summer term.</p>
What do I need to revise?
<p>The paper is unseen so you cannot learn any specific answers.</p> <p>However, you can revise:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The what how why structure. • SPaG – spelling, punctuation and grammar. • How writers write narrative fiction by reading at home for pleasure.

What will my assessment look like?
<p>A 45-minute assessment paper.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • This covers topics from the whole year. • You will be allowed to use a calculator. • You will need a pen, pencil, and ruler. • If you have protractor and compasses, these will also be useful.
What do I need to revise?
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Place value. • Bar charts and Venn diagrams. • Fractions, decimals, percentages. • Algebra: like terms and substitution. • Operations with fractions. • Area. • Properties of triangles. • Sequences.
