Subject: English

What will my assessment look like?

A 45-minute assessment paper which will assess two English skills: reading and writing

- **Reading:** you will read a short extract from An Inspector Calls. You will then be asked to answer 9 questions asking you to explain the meaning of words, to retrieve key information from the text and explain why the writer has chosen to use particular language to describe certain things. You should use what how why structure to help you answer the extended answer question.
- Writing: you will then be asked to write an evaluative piece of writing about the topic of An Inspector Calls. You will be given a question and some prompts to guide you.
- There will also be a final NGRT test to see how much your reading age has improved over the year and you will continue to be assessed on SPaG in lessons. This will take place in lessons before the end of the summer term.

What do I need to revise?

- An Inspector Calls.
- SPaG spelling, punctuation and grammar.

What will my assessment look like?

One 60-minute paper.

The paper will be a mix of short and long answer questions on content and practicals.

What do I need to revise?

Everything covered in years 7, 8 and 9. With focus on:

- Biology:
 - $Cells\ Breathing\ Digestion\ Respiration\ Photosynthesis\ Human\ Reproduction.$
- Chemistry:
 - Particle Model, periodic table, separating mixtures, and the whole of chemical reactions.
- Physics:

Contact forces, electricity and magnetism, Energy transfers and Wave properties and effects.
